Final Notifications

Restricted entry of High-risk Food items under specific ports

In continuation to FSSAI public notice 17th October 2022, wherein FSSAI invited comments/ representation from Stakeholders with respect to restriction of the import of High-Risk Food Products through designated 61 ports only. Further, considering the comments from stakeholders, FSSAI notified a total of 79 designated POE for the import of high-risk products vide order dated 11th January 2023 and the said order will be effective from 01.03.2023.

TRAINING AND CAPACITY BUILDING

- a. **Food Handlers-** FoSTaC Training programme of FSSAI focuses on ensuring Good Manufacturing Practices (GMP) and proper hygiene and sanitation in food service establishments. These short duration training programs for food handlers are being organized regularly through empanelled Training Partners and trainers. During January, 2023, 16752 food handlers were trained through 510 Food Safety Supervisor trainings.
- b. **Regulatory Personnel and FSSAI officials-** FSSAI is also regularly conducting trainings for Regulatory Personnel and Regular employees of FSSAI. Details of trainings conducted during the month of During January, 2023 for such personnel are as follows:

ORDERS/ADVISORIES/CLARIFICATIONS-

- A direction dt. 06.01.2023 under Section 18 (2) (d) read with Section 16 (5) of FSS Act 2006 has been issued for re-operationalisation of Food Safety Standards (Labelling and Display) amendment regulation 2022 related to labelling requirements of non-retail containers, minimally processed food, tolerance limit, warning statement related to pan masala.
- 2. Vide order dt. 11.01.2023 the escalation matrix for raising grievances/queries related to Central Licenses/Application has been issued. The FBO aggrieved by decision taken by the Central License Authority may represent its case to Concerned Regional Director and further Executive Director (Compliance Strategy) as the case may be as per the cited order.
- Instant renewal of License/Registration with conditions like no change in the existing details etc has been allowed vide order dt. 11.01.2023 for facilitating ease of doing business.
- 4. Vide order dt. 13.01.2023 Manufacturers (including repacker and relabeller) have been mandated to upload their six-monthly lab testing reports as per condition of license number 12 of schedule 2 of FSS (Licensing and registration) of Food Businesses, 2011 through FoSCoS or link such lab reports from the InFoLNet where the samples were analyzed by FSSAI Notified labs.
- 5. All Regional Directors of FSSAI and Commissioners of Food Safety were requested to check compliance of labelling provisions wrt to misleading products in markets in name of "Ghee/Butter" manufactured or sold under their jurisdiction including online platforms/websites vide order dt. 23.01.2023.

Release of funds under MoU framework

- 1. Under the Scheme of MoU with States/UTs, FSSAI has been providing financial and technical assistance to States/UTs since 2020-21 against approved work plans to address the gaps in the food safety ecosystem and improve the overall food safety status in the county. These activities include upgrading State Food Testing eco-system, organizing various FSSAI initiatives, conducting IEC activities, setting up helpdesk for licensing & registration, audits of State licensed FBOs, testing of samples in FSSAI empanelled private laboratories, organizing Basic FoSTAC training for FBOs etc. Funds are provided under Central Sector Scheme as well as from non-CSS funds. During January, 2023, a sum of Rs. 2834.89 lakh (CSS- Rs. 842.00 lakh, non-CSS Rs.1992.89 lakh) was released to three States.
- Overall, under the MoU framework during current financial year 2022-23, an amount of Rs.8483.67 Lakh under Central Sector Scheme (SoFTeL) and Rs. 19742.62 lakh under non-CSS totaling Rs. 28226.29 lakh (282.26 Crore) has been released to 35 States/UTs till end of January, 2023.

4. "Hygiene Rating Challenge" was launched in the month of January 2023 for NetProFaN chapters with an objective to create awareness about hygiene and food safety compliance among FBOs and maximise the registration of FBOs/eateries under the Hygiene Rating scheme.

Quality Assurance Division

1. Notification of Food Testing Laboratories:

Ross Lifescience Limited, Pune , Audentes Labs & Analytics Pvt. Ltd, Thane, Maharashtra Divisional Food Laboratory, Belagavi ,Divisional Food Laboratory, Mysore, National Food Laboratory (Extension Center Raxaul) Raxaul, Bihar has been notified as Primary & Referral food testing Laboratory under Section 43 (1) of

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Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006. This has brought the total number of primary food testing laboratories to 231 and number of Referral food testing laboratories to 22.

2. <u>Strengthening of Food Testing System in the Country including provision</u> of Mobile Food Testing Labs:

a) Strengthening of lab

Rs 800 lakhs were released under Central Sector Scheme for strengthening of state food testing lab by setting up basic food testing lab, micro lab etc

b) Capacity Building:

FSSAI conducted 2 Hands-on Training programs for State/UTs, laboratory personnel conducted in coordination with (i) (i) Choksi Laboratories Pvt. Ltd, Indore Madhya Pradesh (ii) Bureau Veritas Laboratories Pvt. Ltd Chennai. 27 participants attended these training program.

ITC-FSAN, Mumbai conducted 11 training programs in online and offline mode for FBOs, Students & Regulatory Staff, labs personnel from State etc. 350 participants attended these training programs.

c)Food Safety on Wheels (FSW)

Total number of FSWs has become 168, after the procurement of 3 FSWs by State FDA, Uttar Pradesh and 4 FSWs by State FDA, Tamil Naidu.

3. <u>Recognition of accreditation bodies for Food Testing Laboratories:</u>

FSSAI has issued a notice dated 28th December to recognize & approve accreditation bodies by the Food Authority to accredit Food Testing Laboratories.
